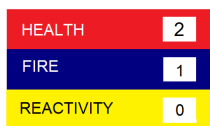

### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1 Description of first aid measures

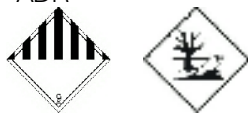
